meet you all and for you to see the children's work that had been discussed at Parent's Evening. The rooms were full of a happy buzz!

Year 2 Learning

*PLAYK\$ HISTORY

We enjoyed celebrating Black History Month in Year 2 and enjoyed learning about Rosa Parks and her significance in History. Her story inspired animated discussions in each class and linked to our school value of equality.

We also learned about Tinga Tinga art. Tingatinga art was first created in Tanzania, East Africa in the 1960's. It all began with a man called Edward Saidi Tingatinga. Unemployed and desperate to earn some money, Edward Tingatinga decided to try and paint pictures to sell to tourists visiting Tanzania. He is now seen a famous and successful artist! We loved creating artwork in his style! Our Tinga Tinga leaves are stunning!

Our learning this half term begins with **The Gunpowder Plot!** In **History**, we will be researching facts about the event and those involved. We will link this event to how and why we celebrate November 5th with firework displays — especially our own Priory Rise fireworks event! We will then move on to **The Great Fire of London and The Great Plague**. We will discover when, where and how they started and how they ended.



In **English**, we begin our half term as poets creating our firework poems and will be using our very best ambitious vocabulary to wow our readers!

In **Phonics** we will be continuing using our sounds and applying them to our reading and spelling. We will be focussing on our spelling using Little Wandle Bridge to Spelling.

We will then move on to non-Fiction text linked to our History learning and will be writing about The Gunpowder Plot. We will then move on to recount writing linked to our learning about The Great Fire of London!

In **DT** we will be learning about moving mechanisms and will be making sliders, pivots and levers and wheels. We will apply our skills to plan, make and evaluate moving pictures of The Great Fire of London.



In **RE** we will be learning about the Jewish faith and the story of Hannukah and will also learn about the Christian faith and the story that surrounds Christmas.

In **Science** we are learning about materials, their properties, and their suitable uses in the environment and in our general lives.

In **Maths** we will be learning about 2D and 3D shapes and will then move onto fractions and looking at fractions of a shape.

Year 2 Home Learning

Reading

How we move from phonics books to colour banded books in Year 2

The Year 2 children continue to follow Little Wandle phonics books until they know all of their sounds and have shown comprehension and fluency in all of the phases. We assess the children each half term as well as using our teacher assessment in Guided Reading. Some of our children are now ready to move from phonic readers.

Once the children have achieved fully in phonics and decodable books, they will be using colour banded books as their reading books. These will be matched to their reading skills and assessed using PM Benchmarking.

As with the phonic books, they will be assessed for:

accuracy = reading words with accuracy

comprehension = checking that they fully understand what they are reading by answering a range of questions about the text

fluency = reading words with automaticity/speed blending at a good pace, aiming for 90 words a minute

prosody = reading with expression, using the punctuation to support this

The children will continue to change their books once a week, to ensure that they are able to take their time and enjoy the books. Re-reading a book is a great way to encourage fluidity and prosody.

Thank you for reading each night with your child and for adding comments in the red reading record.

Maths

We use an online homework for our maths MyMaths homework is set each week and is linked to the work we are learning in class. The children can do each piece as many times as they wish and can try to improve their scores.

This homework is set every Friday.



Spelling

Each **Friday**, on Google Classroom, we will place the sounds we have been learning and some of the words that we need to know how to spell.


In PSHE, we will continue with our scheme of work 'Jigsaw' and we will continue to have a value for each month.

A firm favourite with all children! This is the story of a little fish who learns to show humility.


